This is great opportunity for an experienced Residential Construction Foreman. This is a working foreman position and also requires you to bring your leadership qualities and have a personality that can work well with volunteers!

This position is full-time with benefits that include medical, dental and vision, life insurance, long-term disability, employee assistance program (EAP), Flex Savings Account (FSA), retirement match, paid time off, holidays, and use of a company truck. MISSION | What We Do:

San Diego Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities, and hope. Habitat was founded on the conviction that every man, woman, and child should have a stable and affordable home. Habitat builds houses for affordable homeownership on donated or reduced-cost land throughout San Diego County. We also work with communities to revitalize neighborhoods and repair houses in cities where we build new homes. We have built homes in San Diego, El Cajon, Imperial Beach, Carlsbad, Escondido, Oceanside, Lakeside, and National City.

San Diego Habitat is gearing up to build 30 units per year. Habitat builds homes with volunteer labor (mechanical, electrical, and foundations are subbed out), and fundraising efforts include corporate partnerships, foundation and government grants, in-kind materials, corporate.

JOB SUMMARY:

The Construction Foreman is a Working Foreman position. The ideal candidate will have well-rounded construction site experience. The Construction Foreman is responsible for daily work on a residential construction site, day to day project related site oversight and safety, providing skilled journeyman level work and skill management of the construction project. The duties of the Construction Foreman include coordination and daily progress of building construction activities, working with unskilled to skilled volunteers, while maintaining the project's schedule and providing quality control.

ESSENTIAL JOB RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

Site Responsibilities

- Lead daily construction of residential homes with mostly unskilled volunteers from corporations, faith organizations and veteran or active military groups, and interested individuals (foundations, mechanical and electrical are subbed out)
- Assure construction safety, quality, and specification compliance
- Supervise daily construction efforts to ensure project is constructed in accordance with design, codes, budget, and schedule requirements
- Communicate site rules regarding safety procedures to volunteers and enforce those rules
- Coordinate, and manage onsite volunteer functions along with material control and logistics
- Provide technical assistance, construction document interpretation, and recommendation of construction methods and equipment as required
- Assist construction management in developing and implementing the project schedule

Training

- Provide construction skills training for volunteers of widely varying ability levels
- Provide daily site safety meetings and continuous safety compliance

Personnel Supervision

- Assign volunteers according to their abilities to the jobs/tasks that are needed
- Cultivate "regular" volunteers to provide ongoing site support
- Perform all work in the utmost safe manner, with integrity, humility, and respect of others

Administrative

- Manage all necessary paperwork to include construction material purchase receipts and invoices and code for payment
- Provide project verbal weekly updates

Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Ability to successfully perform the essential responsibilities of the position.
- Minimum of 10 years of hands on experience in all phases of residential construction.
- Minimum of 2-5 years as a construction site Foreman.
- Must have the ability to read construction plans, manage plan changes and speak effectively with city building inspectors and city department personnel on issues that arise during each phase of construction.
- Must possess the ability to work well with skilled and unskilled volunteers, professional trade partners and engineers.
- Excellent interpersonal communication skills
- Teaching and/or volunteer experience and background in nonprofit organizations a plus
- A desire to lead (and develop leadership) individuals from all backgrounds in the construction of decent affordable housing with building excellence.

REQUIRED SKILLS/KNOWLEDGE/ABILITIES:

- Technical Skills: Thorough knowledge of all aspects of construction including technology, equipment, and construction methods required for effective performance by subcontractors, volunteers, and partner families.
- Safety: Demonstrates a commitment to a culture of safety in all aspects of construction, proactive
 daily awareness, training and maintenance of a safe and tidy job site at all times. Lifting, carrying,
 climbing, use of power tools, weather/heat tolerance.
- Organization Skills: The ability to set priorities, assign tasks, and function under deadlines and shifting priorities, and identify and resolve problems.
- Communication: Consistently provides timely information to General Superintendent, main consistent in keeping a professional demeanor at all times.
- Team motivation + supervisory skills: Ability to engage, train and supervise a range of volunteers providing a rewarding experience.
- Open and welcoming of people of any faith or no faith, individuals of diverse populations, and socioeconomic backgrounds.
- Commitment to nonprofit service with an interest in the mission of increasing affordable housing in San Diego County.
- Demonstrates a high level of ethics, integrity, diplomacy and initiative.
- Computer literacy in MS Office applications Outlook, Excel, Project, and Word.

- 90% OUTSIDE: Works in outside conditions that occasionally include inclement heat; Noise level will be loud at times.
