# Global Mission Fund

Supported by U.S. affiliate tithe, the Global Mission Fund provides critical funding for Habitat programs outside of the United States. Fund distribution is determined by Habitat for Humanity International's senior leadership. This funding is often used as leverage for institutional or foundation grants, to pilot innovative programs, or to fill gaps in program budgets.

One hundred percent of your tithe is sent internationally, where it can be used to build resilient communities in Indonesia, increase access to safe water in Mexico, upgrade slums in Ethiopia, or help Habitat's mission in so many other ways.

# The following are examples of the type of work that the Global Mission Fund supports around the world:

## \$200,000 to improve water and sanitation facilities in Egypt

In partnership with the Ministry of Education and other local partners, Habitat Egypt will work with four public primary schools in rural Egypt to improve their water and sanitation facilities and their pupils' hygiene practices. This work will directly improve health for 2,720 children and school staff members.

#### \$200,000 to build resilient communities in Indonesia

Habitat Indonesia will restart its work in one of the poorest subdistricts, Yogyakarta province, to build 35 new houses and 12 water and sanitation facilities and to train at least 100 households on community resiliency and capacity using a community empowerment methodology known as PASSA – participatory approach for safe shelter awareness.

#### \$225,000 to increase access to safe water in Mexico

The Raramuri Indigenous group live in Mexico's largest state, Chihuahua, which has an extreme climate and little access to safe drinking water. Habitat Mexico will continue its work in this region to provide 1,000 Indigenous people with safe water through the installation of community water systems. In addition, Habitat will train community members to maintain the systems and share best practices in water and sanitation.

## \$193,000 to make the living and learning environment safer in Tanzania

Habitat Tanzania will focus on supporting the most vulnerable, particularly women and young girls, by providing 25 latrines in schools and communities. Habitat also will support the training of 1,000 schoolgirls in menstrual management and support the creation of safe hygiene clubs in 20 schools.
